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SPRING INTO SUMMER WALKING CHALLENGE

What is the Spring into Summer Walking Challenge?

The Spring into Summer Walking Challenge is a self paced walking challenge. Our aim is for participants to increase the amount of exercise in their daily lives, in a self paced matter with support from Hill End Community Nurse Jim Schumacher, and the LEAN staff. The challenge will run for 12 weeks starting in December 2011- ready for the New Year's resolutions!!! *What is involved*?

The Spring into Summer Walking Challenge involves participants being given pedometers, fact sheets, and record cards. Participants can choose if they wish to use a pedometer or not (Instructions and a hand out will be supplied with regard to the use of Pedometers).

Record cards will be supplied for the recording of time spent walking, and the distance walked. It is up to the individual to walk as far, and for whatever distance they like. Support and advice will be

available to participants in getting started and how to reach your goal. *Who can participate?*

NSW Fisheries bring endangered Trout Cod to Hill End.

The NSW Fisheries Department and other interested persons visited us at school to talk about and show us some Trout Cod fingerlings. They were on their way to release them into the Macquarie River. Trout Cod are an endangered native species. There are now only three self sustaining populations of Trout Cod remaining in the wild. They were originally described from the Macquarie River, where they have not been recorded since the 1820's, other than a single unconfirmed record from the Turon River in the 1970's.











All students will take home a NSW Fisheries calendar, book, poster etc Thankyou to NSW Fisheries for teaching about this important endangered species - **Trout Cod.**

School History Snippet

During 1941, 48 was subscribed by the pupils for War Savings Certificates, salvage was collected and the children were congratulated on the splendid amount of knitting done under Mrs Walpole's supervision for the red cross. Negotiations were started at this stage to secure the land on the eastern boundary of the school as a children's play centre, but it wasn't until 1949 that transfer of the land was completed, as difficulty was found in tracing the legal owner of one of the blocks of land.

By this time William Nicholson was Headmaster. An assistant had been restored in 1946 to the school once more, after it having been without one for most of the years since 1938.

The next 20 years passed without causing many ripples on the calm surface of life in Hill End. Enrolment hovered around 40 with Principal following Principal in regular procession. Maxwell Pursar, John Fitzgerald, Thomas Ireland, Darel Mullen, Colin Joyce and Tom Shuker, who left at the end of 1969.
