






### **School History Snippet**

**Distinguished ex-students** - It seems to be mainly in the field of education that the former pupils of Hill End Public School made their mark. The list of high ranking Principals in the Department of Education is far above what one would expect from a relatively small place such as Hill End.

Luke Blumer, George Christie, Edgar George Evans, Harry Walpole, The Hodge Brothers, Russell and Harold, Evelyn Piesley all excelled in the Department of Education.

William A Anderson became Secretary of the State Railways. Stuart Kay became a doctor and later Mayor of Mackay in Queensland, Valentine Ackermann became a solicitor and was well known in Sydney legal circles in the 1920's. Jim Willard won the Australian Tennis Title in the 1920's and also captained the first Australian Tennis Team to compete at an Olympic Games. The Goddard brothers, Joe and Ned were very successful in boxing, Joe winning the Australian Heavyweight Championship in the 1880's.
