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Canberra Excursion Recount


Monday 7th of November



HISTORY SNIPPET

Many Hill End people became dependent for water supply on holes which they dug near their huts. Food was very dear. Much of it was produced on farms near Bathurst and was brought by road at a charge of £12 per ton, and sold in Hill End and Tambaroona on an inflated sellers' market.

A letter dated 21st March, 1878 from Mr. Blumer to the Secretary of the Council of Education indicates that the more stable elements of the population were then starting to withdraw.

"Since Christmas (1877) the place has declined very considerably, as the accompanying return will show. Many families are leaving every week, and more intend to do so at an early date. One of the surest evidences of the unpromising state of the place is the fact that several individuals who have been here many years and who have been foremost in assisting in developing some of the principal claims, are now making preparations for an early departure."
