School History Snippet

Further alterations and additions to the school wore made in 1877. It had been suggested that an additional classroom be crected on the girlo' wing but this proposal was vetoed on the grounds that the symmetry of the building would t be compromised?

and the incidence of colds and sickness greatly increased as a consequence. It was obvious that the population was declining slowly as families moved out and so the local education council's battle for botter accommodation was fairly futile. A letter from Mr Blumer to the Secretary of the Council of Education supports this.

" Since Christmas (1877) the place has declined very confiderably, as the accompanying return will show. Many families are leaving every week, and more " intend to do so at an early date: One of the surest evidences of the unpromising state of the place is the fact that several individuals who have been here many years and who have been foremost in assisting in developing some of the principal claims, are now making preparations for an early departure. "

Early in 1879 a verandah was added to the girlo' school and a wooden floor constructed in the weather shed. These additions, plus painting and general repairs were performed by Thomas Ackland for £95.
