"GHOST TOWN" MAY BOOM AGAI

Only 300 live today where 30,000 lived in the gold rush days — but Hill End may yet regain some of its former glory.

HILL END, in N.S.W., is a mining "ghost town" that may yet come alive again.

Most famous of the goldmining boom towns of N.S.W., it may regain some of its past importance if a new venture there, backed by overseas capital, is successful.

capital, is successful. Once second only to Sydney and Newcastle in size and importance, it is now almost a ghost town, pitted with abandoned goldmines and littered with the rubble of hundreds of houses.

Hill End played a great part in Australia's development, but. unlike its Victorian counterparts, Ballarat and Bendigo, it began to sink into oblivion as soon as gold production dwindled.

Today its chances of regaining anything like past prosperity depend on the success of a venture which began in 1949 and which has so far shown encouraging, but not sensational, returns.

A large Melbourne company. Devon Gold N.L., formed by the principals of one of the largest sharebrokers and underwitters in Australia, Ian Potter and Co. together with representatives of overseas capital, has been granted an option to work the
