They had to stay there for four weeks. Ivey was still very sad until she found out she was going back home.

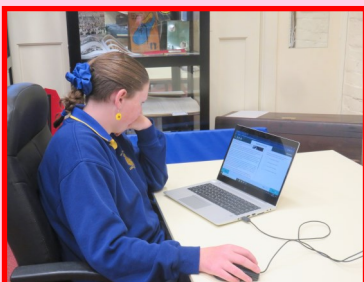
They went home and all the water was gone.

She was so happy, the house was destroyed, so they built it again and everything went back to normal.

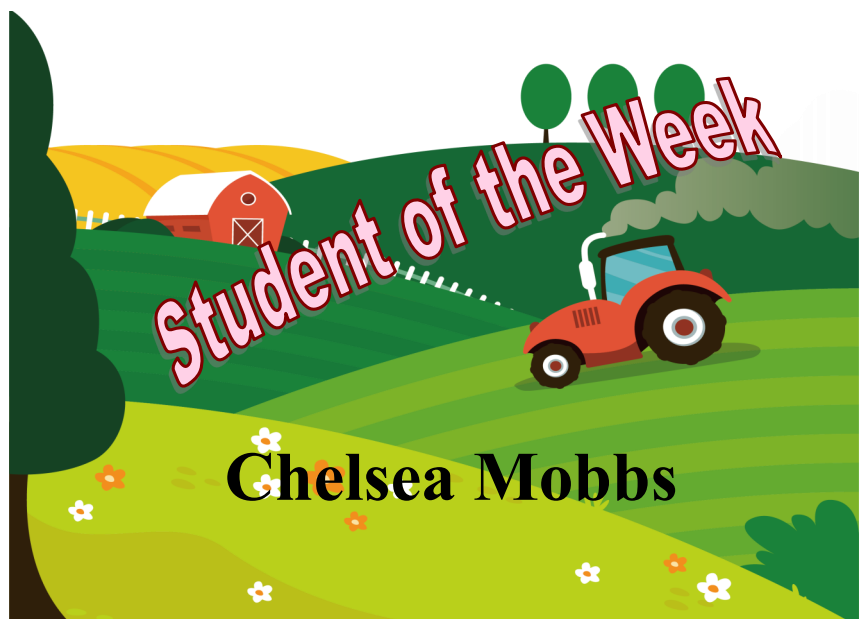

Next Drs clinic is Wednesday October 4th

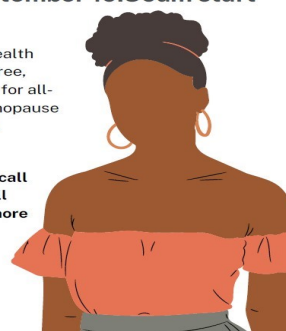
