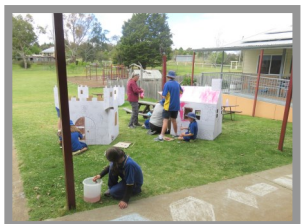
Musica Viva practice with Mrs Smyth

Cyber Security Awareness Month

Follow these 5 tips to be cyber secure

1. Use strong, unique passphrases

Set strong passphrases and update them regularly for both work and personal accounts. Don't use the same passphrase across multiple accounts and use a reputable password manager.

2. Recognise and report phishing

Before you open an attachment or click on a link, ask yourself do you know the sender, is the subject vague, and is it asking you to click on anything or give away personal information? Know how to check a hyperlink before you click or tap on it. Hover your mouse or tap and hold on the phone to see the real URL. If it looks suspicious, do not click on it. Report and delete!

3. Enable MFA

Put a second layer of security around your accounts and information. That way, even if the hackers crack your password, they won't be able to log in as you and access your information

4. Update your software

Set up your devices and applications so they receive automatic software updates. The updates will protect you from previously exploited vulnerabilities.

5. Be social media smart

Don't give away personal information such as date of birth, address or any sensitive information on your social media profiles. Hackers use social engineering tactics to try and build information about you. Avoid Facebook quizzes that give away your date of birth details, or maiden name. Also, turn off your real-time location when using apps.



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
